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We are Lyng Hall - Careers' Day

Earlier this term, the whole of KS3 participated in a drop down carousel careers' day welcoming external visitors from different career paths to deliver an exciting and informative day!



Such a 'memorable day' according to one teacher at Lyng Hall. We hosted the first 'in person' careers' day for key stage 3 students. This consisted of a mixture of live theatre workshops, led by the Army and DHL, virtual workshops run by the Department for Work and Pensions, Severn Trent and the Access Creative College, and finally, classroom visits for all year groups involved by Jaguar Land Rover.

The DHL session wowed the students with how far the logistics company reaches in terms of global scale and the fact that animals such as camels are used for transportation for DHL in the desert! Furthermore, the students got to meet with DHL employees, learn from them and ask about business opportunities.

Seven volunteers from Jaguar Land Rover visited all key stage 3 students across the 3 hours of their visit. They were matched to different ability groups by our wonderful 6th formers who volunteered to meet, greet and network with employers, acting as floating volunteers for the day. JLR delivered scenario based activities and shared their stories of going from school into employment. The youngest employee was 19 years of age and was an excellent role model for our pupils!

The virtual workshops from Severn Trent, Access College and DWP, were symbolic of how Lyng Hall have maintained their link to virtual and hybrid ways to work, since Covid 19. The virtual system was easy to access and reached more classes. It allowed teachers to be involved and it enabled students to still speak with an external employer. There were quizzes, questions and answers as well as thought provoking videos shared.

The Army were in the Theatre and delved deep into the range of careers possible with them. It was enlightening to hear the personal story of Sgt Matt Gandy but also hear some of the questions that were asked, such as: "What was your toughest mission?" and "Have you ever handled a gun?". Both questions presented a limited view of the army careers but the guests did a fabulous job of quashing the misconceptions that a career in the army is limited to just the battlefield. Furthermore, key discussions and questions regarding apprenticeships and technical, vocational routes were asked.



The Careers' Day also gave employers and virtual presenters an opportunity to discuss with students, the technical qualifications such as apprenticeships and T- levels which they offer within their organisations, satisfying the requirements for the provider access legislation 2023.

As a result of our first careers carousel day for KS3, the following Gatsby benchmarks were achieved:


Benchmark I— A stable careers programme. This was our first Careers carousel day and it was in honour of our wide careers programme.



First Places: Caitlyn Valentine from 8R




