What is your favourite subject? Maths because I find it easy. But I also love PE, and especially football.


What's one highlight since joining Lyng hall? I think Swimming because I am the best! I might even do some swimming when I go to Scotland with my family in the holidays.

What is your favourite subject? I love doing Art lessons because Mrs Cooper makes the lessons so fun—we like making a mess!


What's one highlight since joining Lyng hall? Probably my achievement points so far









College – Update


COLLEGE POINTS PER PUPIL



Centaur have managed to hold onto first place - for now - but this could change as Pegasus are not far behind! The battle seems to be between Griffin and Pegasus. Griffin began the championship in fourth place but, seem to be working their way up the ladder, in quite a short amount of time. Miss Gaggini is surprised that the other colleges seem to be 'giving-it-up' to Griffin, with very little competition. Griffin were our college championship winners last year but, there are lots of pupils deserving of a first-place win. Dragon started off in third place but have already allowed themselves to drop to the bottom of the league, with quite a considerable gap between them and Griffin. Dragon are the only college to have never won the championship and this is a real shame, as so many Dragon pupils work hard to earn their college positive points. Unfortunately, the high number of negative points from only a few of the pupils in Dragon college, are what hold their team at the bottom of league.
